Dear Principal Ladies and gentlemen, teachers,



The C14 PARIS show is a springboard show dedicated to sculptural ceramics (object, installation, mixed media and performance under certain conditions).

By bringing together all the players in the contemporary ceramics and trade ecosystem (schools, galleries, collectors, art centres, museums, curators, agents), the show aims to help young ceramic artists become professional artists.

The Salon is run by an association under the law of 1901, whose members are all volunteers. The board is made up of three specialists in contemporary French, European and international ceramics:

- Ludovic Recchia, director and curator of the Keramis Centre in La Louvière, Belgium, and President of C14 PARIS
- Frédéric Bodet, former curator of modern and contemporary collections at Sèvres Cité de la Céramique, independent curator, lecturer at HEAD Geneva and author, treasurer of C14 PARIS
- Stéphanie Le Follic-Hadida, PhD in art history (Paris I), graduate of the École du Louvre, independent curator, lecturer, author and secretary of C14 PARIS.

In 2023, the association's management changed and its board of directors expanded to include a wider range of skills, including artists, teaching artists, directors of institutions, collectors... The list is endless!

The C14 PARIS show is supported by private and institutional partners: Fondation Bruckner (Switzerland), Centre Keramis (Belgium), Centre Céramique de La Borne (Cher), Académie internationale de la Céramique (AIC Genève), art galleries (PULS, La Peau de l'ours in Belgium, Galerie Polaris and Bernard Utudjian in Paris, etc.).

Until now, we have been in the habit of inviting a school to present its best students in ceramics. Having listened carefully to the teaching staff and friends who run the schools, we decided to quickly put the pupils and students in the real conditions of a selection process on a French and European scale, within the framework of a competition open to students developing a sculptural approach to ceramics (table-top sculptures, wall or floor installations, etc.).

Applicants must either be in their final year of school or have graduated the previous year. This applies to students at art colleges, design and applied arts schools and those in the "Creators" section of training centres (Guebwiller, Dieulefit, Ema-Cnifop).

The winner will be chosen by the college of active members of the association. He/she will be awarded the "PRIX INTER-ECOLES 2025...". He/she will benefit from the same advantages as the other exhibitors (stand, double-page spread communication, access to the Jury / Gallery and Residence prizes).

Stand lighting is provided. For fire safety reasons, the addition of spotlights or electrical sockets is prohibited. Any additional sockets (for video broadcasting, for example) must be requested, and the town's technical teams will provide professional assistance.

The winning student undertakes to remain on his stand throughout the show, at the agreed opening times.

The material issues of scenographic production, accommodation and transport of the works and scenographic furniture are a strictly internal matter for discussion between the school and the student.

The school that accepts the prize-winner's application will have to pay the registration fee required of everyone, i.e. ≤ 350 , in a more flexible form: when the online application is submitted, the head of the school will make a written commitment to pay the ≤ 350 if a candidate from the said school is awarded the prize.

In view of the prestige that will inevitably result from this drastic selection (only 1 winner for all the schools), we are convinced that the school that forged this career path will be happy to publicise this exemplary achievement. It should also be noted that, in exchange for its payment to the student, the School will be able to promote its establishment and its ceramics training free of charge during the 4 days of the show, from 2 to 5 October 2025, on the ground floor, which will be transformed into an ephemeral café/lounge for the occasion. The school may or may not stay for the four days. The choice is up to them. The school will also receive a double-page spread in the year's catalogue.

As part of this competition, the C14 PARIS association would be delighted to establish close links with the teaching teams and school headmasters. Together, we can certainly imagine improvements and follow-ups to this initiative.

We would like to thank you for encouraging your pupils and students to take part in this competition, for giving applicants the warmest of welcomes and for accepting this role as a privileged partner.

DEADLINE FOR APPLICATIONS

Entries are open on the C14 PARIS website between 15 April and 31 May. The winner will be elected before 15 June.he school will make a written commitment to pay the €350 if a candidate is unable to attend.

The application must be composed as follows:

- Letter of intent or motivation (15 lines max)
- Short CV
- Project description (15 lines max)
- 10 compressed visuals of work (existing and work in progress, projection drawings) + 1 HD
- 1 compressed portrait visual
- Standard application form signed and stamped by the director of the school from which the student(s) is/are applying to pay the exhibition registration fee (€350).
